- **Buckles Solicitors** -find out about wills and trusts
- **Core Assets** - here to help with the new EHC plans (replacing statements)
- **Department for Work and Pensions** is responsible for welfare, pensions and child maintenance policy. As the UK's biggest public service department it administers the State Pension and a range of working age, disability and ill health benefits.
- **Health watch** - At a local level, local Health watch will work to help local people get the best out of their local health and social care services. Whether it's improving them today or helping to shape them for tomorrow.

- **LCYC P** - develop an inclusive approach to working with carers and partners. LCYCP gives carers and partners the opportunity to become involved in making the Lincolnshire Carer's Strategy a reality and help shape the Carer's Agenda.
- **Spurgeons** –works in partnership with other agencies to support young carers and young adult carers (18-25) individually and within their families in a range of ways.
- **SILCS** – Sensory Impairment Service for Adults and children in Lincolnshire. The service aims to create opportunities for adults and children by building confidence and self esteem, developing communication skills, promoting independent living and developing mobility skills.
- **Rethink Mental Illness** – is a charity that believes a better life is possible for people affected by Mental Illness. Rethink Mental Illness runs services and support groups that change people's lives and challenge attitudes about

Mental Illness. One service Rethink runs is the Carers support service. They can also help with Carers Assessments and Emergency Plans, individual support, advice and practical help

- **Home from Home Care Ltd**- provides a range of specialist needs-led services for adults (17-64) with learning disabilities and complex support needs including Autism, Epilepsy, Severe Learning Disabilities, Profound and Multiple Learning Disabilities, Sensory Impairment and associated Health & Mental Health issues.
- **AK & I Uk** -are a 'Not for Profit' Education and Training provider, committed to working with learners to help them to develop, grow and achieve. They deliver good quality training to help young people and adults to gain skills to improve their lives and succeed. They try and empower people to achieve through their improvement programmes, promoting social and economic inclusion, implementing equality and diversity to all aspect of their lives. They specialise in helping the disadvantaged and are dedicated to helping people by opening up opportunities so they can develop and grow in order to achieve their goals. Offering independent and impartial advice.
- **The Well Head Centre** –The Well Head Centre is a registered charity which exists to give time and space to those who are facing emotional crisis. They offer this facility to those who are caring full time for family members and need time out from their current situation
- **County Care Independent Living** -County Care supports individuals to maintain and develop their independence and live in their own homes and local community. They are committed to providing individual high quality person centred support. They specialise in supporting adults with learning disabilities, associated conditions and Mental Health to develop the skills they need to live as independently as possible.
- **Pohwer NHS complaints Advocacy** -POhWER delivers information, advice, support and advocacy services throughout England. We aim to support people who face difficult issues and want to make their voice heard.

- **Lincolnshire Partnership Foundation Trust** - Promoting recovery and quality of life through effective, innovative and caring mental health, social care and specialist community services.
- **National Citizen Service** - Benefits of NCS:
 - Young people meet peers from different social and economic backgrounds.
 - Experience being away from parents and the home environment.
 - It challenges young people to try new activities and learn new skills.
 - Develops social and team working skills.
 - Increases confidence and self-esteem.
 - NCS is recognised by UCAS and employers.
- **St Barnabas Lincolnshire hospice**- is Lincolnshire's leading specialist palliative care provider. They have been operating their services since 1982. Last year they cared for over 9000 people living with a life limiting illness. Their services in the community include Hospice at Home, Day Therapy, Welfare, Family Support Service as well as Inpatient Unit in Lincoln, a Hospice within a Hospital at Grantham and a palliative care co-ordination centre. They can give advice and support with a wide range of needs from controlling pain, managing breathlessness and fatigue through to Tai Chi and complementary therapies. All their services are free.
- **LCC 4 all/Local Offer** - The SEN and Disability Local Offer describes what help, support and services are available for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and their families in Lincolnshire.

- **Young Peoples Learning Provision** – is a training provider that supports young people 16-19 or 19-24(with learning difficulties/Disabilities) They work closely with the **Supporting Employment Team (formerly Welfare to work)** –part of childrens services they will be providing information about supporting people into employment (14-25years). This could be Voluntary work, Work placements, Supported internships etc.
- **Independent Travel Trainers** -One-to-one training designed to equip young people who are entitled to home to school transport with the confidence and skills required to travel independently.
- **ESCO Team** -Early Support Care Co-ordination works alongside children and young people with a disability and their families, providing timely support and care coordination that places families at the heart of decision making about their child.
- **Educational Psychologist** – helps with children & young people in educational and early year’s settings.
