




Can I switch it on?

Towers, Tunnels and Turrets

During Spring Term 2, we have been exploring castles, tall towers and hiding under bridges and tunnels. We have been looking at the stories of Rapunzel, Jack and the beanstalk and the three Billy Goats Gruff. We have planted and grown our own beanstalks and had a wonderful time exploring different sized tubes when learning outside the classroom. In Maths this term we have been thinking about measurements, we have been using keywords to find long and short and heavy and light objects linked to our stories.

Then set up your own minibeast laboratory and observe their every move. Add notes and labels and ask your own research questions - just like a real entomologist!

Learn about bees and worms and butterflies too. Can you make a food chain to show who eats who? Carry out investigations to find out more, like how far a snail travels in a day and how a spider catches its prey.


Then animate to show how your favourite bug transforms from one to another, perhaps a caterpillar to a butterfly or a maggot to a fly...urgh!!!!

The Nest Family Learning Ideas







- Go on a minibeast safari with your family, investigate your garden, local park or woodland to search for wriggly and crawly creatures! Take photos or draw any minibeasts you find, then identify them.
- Visit your local library and find stories, poems and non-fiction books.
- Make some minibeasts from playdough -How many legs? Can you create your own?
- Watch a Wriggle and Crawl film (Bug's Life, Epic, Ants) What happened? What was your favourite part?
- Create a minibeast factfile / poster.
- Get creative... draw, paint, collage, model a minibeast choose a real one or invent one from your imagination!
- Be an Entomologist and draw and label the body parts of a favourite minibeast.
- Make and Play a minibeast game like 'Build a beetle' (roll 6 for a head, roll 5 for the body etc).
- Bake some minibeast cakes or decorate some biscuits.









Dolphin New Topic



We will be learning to name body parts, including the heart and bones. We will learn that humans have blood and that we have bones inside our bodies.

We will also be learning about how to take care of our teeth.

In PE, we will discover that exercise makes our hearts beat faster and that we feel 'puffed out' afterwards.

In cooking, we will explore healthy eating.

Here are some ideas for home learning, please do share your wonderful ideas on Tapestry:

- Engage in activities such as bike rides, running, scooters, that raise the heart rate and makes us feel puffed out
- Cook some healthy recipes-fruit smoothies, vegetable pizzas, oat cookies
- Visit a farm shop and look at fruits and vegetables-can your child name them?
- Brush teeth using a timer-how long can they brush for?

Otter & Seal Classes

In Otters and Seals, we have enjoyed learning all about the Romans. We have learned about Roman soldiers, chariots, the Colosseum, Julius Caesar and much more! We have enjoyed listen to our story sacks, exploring Ancient Rome and trying different Roman food and drink! This included bread and grape juice, they were delicious! We have made our own Roman shields and helmets, using them as props for role play with our friends. We thoroughly enjoyed pretending to be charioteers in our Roman Chariot! We have also explored different sensory experiences, such as red and gold rice, sensory bottles and sensory bags.

Otters and Seals have also enjoyed learning all about Potions. We have explored key terminology such as witch, cauldron, spell, broomstick and wand. We have explored our senses by making our very own potion bottles, adding colour, scent and magic dust (which made our potions pop and fizz!). We have enjoyed listening to our story sack 'Room on the Broom' and 'The Witch's Cat'. Our favourite experience was dressing up as a witch or wizard, flying on our broomsticks!

We have had so much fun learning about new things and exploring our key vocabulary. Our next topic is 'Traders and Raiders'.

Romans and Potions

Rabbit class enjoyed learning all about the Romans Spring term 1. We learned all about the rise of the Roman Empire and the fall of The Celts. We had a visit from Jed the Roman soldier who taught us all about Roman and Celt soldiers, their armour and weapons and told the story of Boudicca. We learned about Roman people including Emperors and the different types of houses. We loved showcasing all our terms learning to our families at The Rabbit Class Villa, serenading them with music and serving them delicious Roman food.

Then in Spring term 2 Rabbits have also enjoyed learning all about Potions. We began with our 'wow' experience making bath bombs through trial and error. We gave our successful bath bombs to our mums for Mothers Day. We have been enjoying story writing and rhyming poems in English inspired by our story sacks 'Room on the Broom' and 'Potion Commotion'. We have been exploring capacity in maths. We have been cooking up some storms in the kitchen, linking to our science – states of matter and changing state.


They told us this is because:

We do appreciate that this may not always be possible for parents to do but if Royal Taxis receive advance notice of a passenger not requiring transport, this saves a great deal of time. All operators are to wait for a maximum of 5 minutes from the designated pick up time before continuing on the journey if a passenger has not come out, it would then become parents responsibility to transport in these cases.
