We engaged in washing up, cooking, hanging out washing and tidying up!



Autumn Term 1 – Mix it Up!

We made fizzy potions, investigated melting and freezing using ice cubes and used oil and water to create a fun experiment.


In art, we thoroughly enjoyed using different states of matter to create our artwork, such as colour mixing, paint blowing, puffy paint and even ice cube painting!

In cooking, we investigated melting, solidifying and freezing. We made lots of tasty things to eat and drink, such as ice lollies, smoothies, ice-cream, jelly and we even made our own chocolates!



Autumn Term 2 – Fire and Light

This term we have enjoyed learning all about fire and light. We had a wonderful memorable experience at the beginning of the topic, where we were able to explore a fire engine and talk to some firefighters. We thoroughly enjoyed being able to sit inside the fire engine and hold the fire hose, although it was very heavy!


UKS2 New Topic (Badgers & Squirrels)



Upper Key Stage 2 presents 'Beating Heart' as our topic for this term.

Beating Heart is an engaging topic, introducing children to their heartrate, healthy foods and activities to make our heart speed up e.g. running, jumping.

Children will explore how healthy food help our bodies grow and keep our heart strong.





A key focus is our PE lessons, where we will cover how moving around can change our heartbeat, measuring our heartrate before the activity and after to see if it gets faster. We will be dancing, jogging and much more!

We will also engage in science activities, such as planting seeds to learn about healthy eating and going on a nature walk with active stops and rest stops to see how this affects our heart.





Badger Class



Autumn term 1 — At The Fairground

In autumn term 1, Badgers enjoyed learning about the fairground. Our main focus was looking at what rides we could find at the fair, we rode in our rollercoaster, and we looked for games such as hook a duck, food stalls with candyfloss and much more! We even designed our own fairground activities, such as designing a horse for the carousel, and making wristbands and posters to be used at the fair. In science, we learnt all about how these activities work, looking into the forces of the machines, such as gravity, push and pull. During cooking, we made food that you would find at a fairground, such as popcorn and waffles. We particularly enjoyed listening to our story sacks, 'Sarah and Duck go to the Funfair', 'The Bear, The Hare and The Fair' and 'Maisy's funfair'. We had lots of fun!



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
Badger Class

Autumn Term 2 – Ice Kingdoms

During autumn term 2 in Badgers, we have enjoyed learning all about Ice Kingdoms. Our main focus has been looking at the animals who live there, such as polar bears and penguins. We have particularly enjoyed looking at story sack, reading stories such as 'Flip, Flap, Frozen' and 'The Journey Home'. During science, we have learnt about key vocabulary, such as hot and cold, identifying different objects that are hot and ones that are cold. We have also enjoyed learning about ice and how this can be melted to become water. Also, we have learnt about what the weather does in winter, focusing on snow and how animals and people can stay warm in this weather. For example, in theme, we have looked at adding feathers to a penguin and what clothes we need to wear to keep us warm, such as a coat, snow boots, gloves and a hat. Finally, this term, we also got the chance to go on a trip to a Panathlon – all of the children enjoyed it and were very engaged – we took part in lots of different activities, throwing, running and kicking!



Squirrel Class





Term 1- At the Fairground

Last term, our topic "At the Fairground" was packed with creativity and hands-on learning. The children explored how fairground rides use forces such as push, pull and gravity to move, and they learned how Ferris wheels and spinning rides rely on motors, rotation and balance. In DT, the class applied this knowledge to design and make their own moving fairground rides after first learning how to build a simple electrical circuit. We also looked at how wristbands, tickets and posters use shape, colour and pattern, and how different types of music can change the mood of a ride — fast music for roller coasters and slower music for calming carousels. In English, they explored a range of genres, including poems, narratives and persuasive writing such as posters and leaflets inviting people to visit the fairground.

Term 2- Ice Kingdoms

This half term, the children have been learning all about the polar regions and the amazing environments found there. We have explored how temperatures in the Arctic and Antarctic are often measured in negative numbers and how snow and ice are important parts of the water cycle. The children discovered how animals survive the extreme cold using insulation such as blubber or thick fur, and how we use similar ideas when choosing warm clothes that help keep heat in. We also learned that polar regions have different seasons with changing daylight hours, and we compared the Arctic and Antarctic to see how their animals, landscapes and cultures are unique. The class have all really enjoyed creating a PowerPoint all about their chosen polar animal, and in English we read texts and produced writing based on books such as *The Emperor's Egg* and *Jonty Gentoo* to deepen our understanding of life in these icy places.







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Next term, we are excited to begin our new topic, "Beating Heart." The children will explore how the heart pumps blood around the body and how the circulatory system works to keep us healthy. They will learn that pulse rate shows how fast the heart is beating, discovering how moving makes the pulse faster and resting slows it down. The children



will measure their own pulse and use graphs to show how their heart rate changes. We will look at how fruits, vegetables and grains help build a balanced diet, and how different countries grow different healthy foods that support heart health. Music lessons will explore how rhythm and tempo can match the beat of a resting or active heart, while art lessons will include creating posters and paintings that share heart-health messages. Throughout the term, the children will be encouraged to think independently, extend their knowledge and apply it across subjects as they learn how exercise, diet and relaxation all help care for the heart.
